HIGHLIGHTS FROM JULY 1, 2018 MASSACHUSETTS DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION'S

INSTITUTIONAL FACT CARDS

1) The total number of prisoners under Massachusetts jurisdiction on July 1, 2018 was 9,107, a decrease of 406 prisoners (4.3%) since July 1, 2017.

2) Of the 9,107 prisoners under Massachusetts jurisdiction, the total incarcerated in Massachusetts facilities was 8,728. Thus, 379 Massachusetts prisoners were housed in facilities outside the state. This was a decrease of 30 prisoners (7.3%) from July 1, 2017.

3) The total number of prisoners housed in Massachusetts on July 1, 2018 (8,728) was 376 below the number housed in Massachusetts on July 1, 2017 or a decrease of 4.1%.

4) The total number of criminally sentenced prisoners housed in Massachusetts on July 1, 2018 was 7,917, a decrease of 306 (3.7%) from July 1, 2017. The number of criminally sentenced prisoners held in Massachusetts facilities was 90.7% of the total housed in Massachusetts. Civil Commitments accounted for 5.9%, Pre-Trial prisoners – 2.9%, and prisoners under observation - .5% comprised the remaining 811 prisoners confined in Massachusetts prisons.

5) Of the 8,728 prisoners housed in Massachusetts prisons as of July 1, 2018, 1,662 (19.0%) were in Maximum security – a decrease of 134 (7.5%) from July 1, 2017; 5,932 (68.0%) were housed in Medium security – a decrease of 89 (1.5%) prisoners from July 1, 2017; 955 (10.9%) were housed in Minimum security – a decrease of 94 (9.0%) from July 1, 2017; and 179 (2.1%) were housed in Pre-Release – a decrease of 59 (24.8%) from July 1, 2017.

6) The racial breakdown of the prisoners housed in Massachusetts prisons on July 1, 2018 was: Caucasian -3,814 (43.8%), African-American -2,399 (27.6%), Hispanic¹ -2,235 (25.7%), Asian -124 (1.4%), Native American -56 (.6%), and Other -712 (.8%).

7) From July 1, 2017 to July 1, 2018, the number of Caucasians decreased by 251 or 6.2%; African-Americans decreased by 64 or 2.6%; Hispanics decreased by 49 or 2.1%; Asians decreased by 10 or 7.5%; Native Americans decreased by 2 or 3.4%; and Other decreased by 29 or 29.0%.

8) The breakdown by numbers and percentages of Governing Offenses for prisoners criminally sentenced and housed in Massachusetts facilities was: Person Offense – 4,355 (55%), Sex Offenses – 1,265 (16%), Drug Offenses – 1,107 (14%), Property Offenses – 558 (7%), and Other Offenses – 647 (8%).

9) Of the criminally sentenced prisoners housed in MA on July 1, 2018, 1,107 (14%) had a drug conviction as their governing offense. The institution with the highest percentage was MASAC (63%), with BPRC as the second highest (55%). The institution with the lowest was the MTC (1%), with MCI-Norfolk as the second lowest (6%).

10) Of the criminally sentenced prisoners housed in MA on July 1, 2018, 1,265 (16%) had a sex conviction as their governing offense. The institution with the highest percentage was MTC (84%), with NCCI as the second highest (50%). Minimums and Pre-Release facilities had no prisoners serving a Sex Governing Offense, save SMCC where there was one prisoner whose governing offense was a sex conviction.

¹ While the designation Latino may be preferred, Hispanic is used because that is the designation assigned to this group by the DOC in the Fact Sheets and used in all the years the Lifers' Group has been reporting on the DOC Fact Cards. The designation Hispanic continues to be used in the Lifers' Group reports for consistency over time.

11) Of the criminally sentenced prisoners housed in MA on July 1, 2018, 4,355 (55%) had a person conviction as their governing offense. The institution with the highest percentage was MCI-N (73%), with SBCC as the second highest (72%). The institution with the lowest was the MTC (12%), with MASAC as the second lowest (13%).

12) The number of prisoners housed in Massachusetts with a Governing Offense of a Person Offense decreased by 118 (2.6%) from July 1, 2017; with a Sex Offense decreased by 11 (.9%); with a Drug Offense decreased by 64 (5.5%); with a Property Offense decreased by 72 (11.4%); and with an Other Offense decreased by 26 (3.9%).

13) The breakdown of the number of prisoners housed in Massachusetts serving over fifteen years and up to an including life without parole (First Degree) on July 1, 2018 was: 15+ - 1,143 (14% of the total of criminally sentenced prisoners housed in Massachusetts), Second Degree Life – 967 (12%), and First Degree Life – 1,048 (13%).

14) The total number of criminally sentenced prisoners housed in Massachusetts serving more than 15 years, including life sentences, on July 1, 2018 was: 3,158, an increase of 17 (.5%) from July 1, 2017.

15) The total number of criminally sentenced prisoners housed in Massachusetts prisons serving Second Degree Life sentences on July 1, 2018 was: 967 and 1,048 were serving First Degree Life or Life Without Parole.

16) The total number of prisoners serving life sentences on July 1, 2018 totaled 2,015 an increase of 24 from July 1, 2017. Lifers on July 1, 2018 comprised 25% of the total number of prisoners being housed in Massachusetts – an increase of 1% from July 1, 2017.

- 17) The total number of First Degree Lifers on July 1, 2018 was higher by 17 lifers than those serving First Degree Life on July 1, 2017 an increase of 1.6%.

- 19) The total number of lifers incarcerated at MCI-Norfolk as of July 1, 2018 was 699 or 53% of the total MCI-Norfolk population and 35% of the total number of lifers housed in Massachusetts. MCI-Shirley had the next highest number of lifers was with 277 (19% of the institution's total), followed by OCCC with 224 or 32% of that institution's total number of prisoners as of July 1, 2018.

20) Maximum security institutions on July 1, 2018 were run at 84% of Operational Capacity; Medium security institutions at 91% of Operational Capacity; and Minimum/Pre-Release institutions at 65% of Operational Capacity.

21) Of the 379 Massachusetts prisoners held in facilities outside the state on July 1, 2018, the number of lifers was 60.
