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A Report on DOC Institutional Statistics

This report is based on the data contained within the Department of Correction's (DOC) July 2015 Institutional Fact Cards. The data are as of July 1, 2015. The DOC Institutional Fact Cards can be found on the DOC's website. The Institutional Fact Cards on which this report is based were obtained via a Public Records Request.

This report is contains two parts. First is a listing of Highlights gleaned from reviewing the data. Three Tables comprise the second part which break out the data from the individual Institutional Fact Cards by categories and by institution. The total and percentages for 2013 and 2014 in each Table were taken from the Institutional Fact Cards for each of those years.

Highlights

1) The percentage of prisoners held in maximum security (17.6%) is the highest in three years.

The percentage of prisoners held in medium security (67.4%) is the lowest in three years.

The percentage of prisoners in minimum security dropped slightly in comparison to 2014, from 12.6% to 12.3%.

The percentage of prisoners in pre-release remained constant from 2014 @ 2.7%.

- 2) 443 prisoners are being housed in prisons out-of-state an increase of 2 over 2014. The racial affiliations of those 443 are: 154 Caucasians, 134 African-Americans, 151 Hispanics, 3 Asians, and 1 is Other.
- 3) 89% (9,467) of MA prisoners are criminally sentenced. 6% (604) are being held in pre-trial status in nine separate institutions. 5% (547) are civilly committed and are held in five separate institutions.
- 4) The average age of prisoners held by the DOC has remained the same as 2014 at 40. The oldest prisoner is 92. The youngest is 18, although there is a 16 year old prisoner under MA jurisdiction, but not being held in a MA institution for which an Institutional Fact Card was produced.
- 5) The only institution with populations as of July 1, 2015 in excess of their designed capacities are: MTC (547 designed capacity / 561 population) and MASAC (152 designed capacity / 236 population).

- 5.) cont. The only institutions operating above their designated operational capacities were: MCI-CJ (646 operational capacity / 824 population) and MCI-S (1455 operational capacity / 1464). The populations of all other institutions exceeded their respective design capacities, but were below their respective operational capacities).
- 6. The % of Caucasian prisoners dropped nearly one percentage point, comparing 2014 and 2015 (45.2% to 44.3%).

The % of African-American prisoners remained essentially constant (27.5% to 27.6%).

The % of Hispanic prisoners increased nearly one percentage point (24.1% to 25.0%).

The Racial breakdowns for the six largest institutions were as follows:

- 7. Sixty-one MA lifers are incarcerated out of state. 36 are serving 1st degree sentence and 25 are serving 2nd degree sentences.
- 8. The percentage of lifers has remained constant at 21%, as has the % of 1st degree lifers (11%) and the % of 2ns degree lifers (10%).

The Governing Offenses for the criminally sentenced in the seven largest institutions broke down as follows:

- 10. The following information is specific to MCI-Norfolk:
 - a) The percentage of lifers at MCI-N is 48%, which is 30% higher than the nearest institution, i.e., BSH at 37%.
 - b) 35% of lifers in the DOC are incarcerated at MCI-N.
 - c) 36.2% of the Total DOC jurisdiction are serving over 15 years. This includes lifers. 29.4% of those serving over 15 years are incarcerated at MCI-N.
 - d) 68% of prisoners at MCI-N are serving over 15 years, including lifers. That is 48% higher than nearest institution, i.e., BSH at 46%.
 - e) Norfolk's % of prisoners serving over 15 years (68%) is 48% higher than SBCC (46%), 55% higher than NCCl (44%), 66% higher than OCCC (41%), and 119% higher than MCI-S (31%).
 - f) Norfolk's % of lifers (48%) is 60% higher than SBCC (30%), 100% higher than OCCC (24%), 140% higher than NCCI (20%), and 167% higher than MCI-S (18%).

g) Norfolk's total population was 1425. Of those, 686 were serving life and 967 other prisoners were serving over 15 years.

MCI-S's total population was 1440. Of those, 254 were serving life and 452 other prisoners were serving over 15 years.

Norfolk has 289 serving 10 years or less (20%).

MCI-S has 783 serving 10 years r less (54%).

- 11. The Norfolk LOS (1661) is 481 days higher than the nearest institution, NCCI, at 1180, or 41% higher. The LOS at MCI-S is less than half Norfolk's 788 compared to 1661.
- 12. The Total Design Capacity for the DOC as of July 1, 2015 was 7704. The Total Operational Capacity, as defined as the estimated level at which institutions can be safely operated, as of July 1, 2015 was 11,172. The average DOC population is 10,779, or 96.5% of Operational Capacity. Based on the Operational Capacity, the empty bed space, as of July 1, 2015, totaled 393 (3.5%). Based on the Design Capacity, the DOC is 40% over capacity, i.e., 10,779 7,704 = 3,075 over Design Capacity.

The total jurisdiction population in the DOC as of July 1, 2015 = 10,618, less 10,175 prisoners held in MA institutions, leaves 443 prisoners housed outside MA. Of the 443, 154 are Caucasian, 134 are African American, 151 are Hispanic, 3 are Asian, and 1 is an Other.

As of July 1, 2014, the total DOC jurisdiction population was 10,996, less the 10,555 prisoners held in MA institutions, left 441 held in prisons outside MA.

^{*}The total population for 2014, according to the DOC, was 10,555. The total of the individual institution racial breakdowns, however, is 10,541. The DOC did not provide an explanation for the difference other than that the population figures for Bridge. State H and MTC were provided by those institutions respectively and did agree with the DOC Inmate Management System.

² The Fact Card lists only prisoners serving over 6 years. These have been included in the 5-10 year category.

³ The Fact Card for MTC lists only 310 criminally sentenced prisoners. The total, however, of those with Governing Sentences as listed by the DOC is 322. There is no way to reconcile the difference. The DOC notes: "The population breakdowns at top of fact card were provided by Massachusetts Treatment Center." The referenced population breakdowns include the number 310 for criminally sentenced prisoners.

⁴ The difference in the total of 9,083 from the total of 9,071 in Table 2 is accounted for by the difference (12) in the criminally sentenced prisoners at MTC. See Note 3 above.
